The Offices of Student Life and Housing announce plans for the upcoming academic year, 2020/2021, campus living facilities of Southern Nazarene University. These plans are a result of months of discussion and forecasting and will assist us in being good stewards of our resources as we continue to grow and improve the living-learning environment on campus.

For the fall 2020 housing sign up process the following housing options will be available for students to choose: For women: Hills, Bracken, Asbury and Chapman; For Men: Snowbarger, Hills, Asbury and Chapman. There will be limited space for students in Asbury Apartments, as it will also be used for Theme Housing. A table on the second page outlines the pricing of room and board plans for the upcoming year.

The University's off campus policy currently requires that single students under 22 years of age on September 1st of the given academic year are to live in one of the university's residential living areas.

Southern Nazarene University is a Christian, liberal arts, residential university. These three core values make SNU distinctive. This plan for the 2020/21 academic year and the summer preceding are intended to enhance the living-learning environment and overall student learning experience at SNU. - ✓ All students must live on campus unless approved by the Office of Student Development. All students planning to live off campus must submit the Off Campus Housing Application and receive communication of approval. The application can be found at www.my.snu.edu/forms/.
- ✓ All on campus students are required to have meal plan. Students living in the Residence Halls must have the residential meal plan and students living in the apartment areas may select the apartment meal plan.
- ✓ All Access Plan: This plan allows for unlimited access to the upstairs SNU Dining area between 7:00 am-7:00 pm Monday-Friday as well as brunch and dinner on weekends. Students on this plan may come and go as many times as desired in the upstairs SNU Dining area and may exchange 5 meals each week in Pops at any time.
- ✓ 135 Block Plan: This plan allows for students to enjoy 135 meals throughout the semester in the upstairs SNU Dining area. Students on this plan may use the 135 meals at their leisure in the semester with no restrictions as well as exchange 5 meals each week in Pops at any time.
- √ A 50 Block Plan will be available to all commuter students. The plan includes 50 meals throughout the semester in the upstairs SNU Dining area for \$700. Students on this plan may exchange 5 meals each week in Pops. This meal plan can be chosen on the off campus housing application or added after arriving on campus.
- ✓ All meal plan options include 125 flexible spending dollars available for meals and snacks in The 405 and the Coffee Shop. The 405 is located on the first floor of the Webster Commons and serves a variety of breakfast, lunch and dinner options. The meal exchange feature allows students up to 5 meal exchanges at any time of the day, Monday-Friday in the 405. The Coffee Shop is located in the Library and serves Starbucks coffee and other beverages and snacks.
- ✓ All utilities, wireless and wired internet services as well as laundry service for residents are included in these rates.
- ✓ There are no meal plan waivers issued except for medical reasons as documented through the Disability Services Office and/or a Physician.
- ✓ Single room availability is limited. Rooms are reserved first for students with documented special needs through the Disability Services Office. Single room fee is set at \$400 additional per semester from the standard room offered in the designated building/living area, if space is available, regardless of reason for single room need.
- ✓ Housing and Meal Plan contracts are year-long contracts. A fee is charged as laid out in contract terms when breaking the year-long contract. Housing and meal plans are only operational during the traditional academic year and rates listed above are for dates of operation as listed in the Housing Contract only.
